What is a food chain?

A food chain is how plants and animals get their energy.

A food chain always starts with a **producer**. A **producer** is something that makes it's own food like green plants as they use photosynthesis. The living things that eat producers and other animals are called **consumers**.

A **predator** is an animal that eats other animals. The animals that are eaten are called **prey**.

Predators are at the top of a food chain.






Food chain board game
