



Learners will be expected to produce supporting evidence for in-clusion in their assessment portfolio which will be graded at Pass, Merit or Distinction.

There is a multiple choice test which covers Health and Safety.

Student dress code

Yard rules

- Correct PPE must be worn at all times when carrying out practical tasks. (This will include riding hat, gloves and yard footwear)
- Uniform include: dark coloured (black or navy) jodhpurs (no jeans), dark coloured (black or navy) jumper no hoodies, yard boots; wellies no trainers. In hot weather polo shirt dark colour.
- NO photos or information relating to the college, staff, or horses is to be shared on social media.
- **No phones** on the yard at any time these cause potentially dangerous distractions. Any phone seen on the yard will need to be handed to a member of staff immediately.
- **No earphones** (mp3 players, mobile phones or IPods etc) allowed whilst on the yard. These cause potentially dangerous distractions.
- All jewellery and/or piercings must be removed whilst on the yard to reduce the risk of injury. No plasters to be used to cover piercings.
- No eating or drinking on the yard for hygiene reasons.
- Bad language will not be tolerated.
- **Behaviour** causing unnecessary stress to horses **WILL NOT BE TOLERATED**, and may result in disciplinary action.
- **Students are expected** to attain 100% attendance and punctuality for all sessions.
- All yard gates must be left as closed even if it was open when you went through it!
- The use or possession of alcohol or narcotic substances are forbidden on the college and WILL result in disciplinary action.
- All visitors to the Equestrian Centre MUST be met with politeness and courtesy.
- All yard staff and tutors alike should be treated with respect at all times.

Values and behaviours

Below is the list of the Equine Centre's values and behaviours.

It is expected that all students will adhere to these whilst at College. These values are in place whether you are in the Business department or on the main campus. The values and behaviours are chosen by our students and staff as an agreed Code of Conduct.

Any students who do not abide by the values and behaviours will be issued with a reporting slip (see below) and will be actioned to improve. Failure to improve or poor behaviour could result in you being withdrawn from your course and returned to school.

Fire procedures

Location of fire procedure - on every yard and indoor arena

On discovery of a fire and the fire alarm is ringing you must follow these procedures:

- 1. Stay calm, alert a member of staff and inform them of the location of the fire
- 2. When fire alarm sounds, everyone go immediately to the Assembly Point.

Assemberly Point - car park

You are **NOT** to get involved with firefighting activities

If you are on the yard:

- 1. Make sure that rhe horses are secure
- 2. Leave area and go to the Assembly Point

Accident procedures

If an accident occurs when the first aid is needed, you need to report the accident to your instructor who will assess the situation. If first aid is required then a member of staff with first aid training will be called. First aid boxes can be found in staff offices and arena.

All accidents and near misses must be reported to a member of staff.

In the event of an accident:

- · Keep calm, use your common sense
- · Call for member of staff
- Ensure the area is safe and prevent any further accidents from happening
