# **Qualification information**

Title: IMI Level 1 Certificate in carrying out Periodic Vehicle Maintenance & Inspection

### Overview

This is a Level 1 vocational qualification which provides individuals with an introduction to the knowledge, understanding and practical skills required to gain employment or further study towards the vehicle maintenance and repair industry.

- Health and Safety
- Tools
- Serviceing

#### Skills in Carrying out Periodic Vehicle Maintenance and Inspection

- Engines
- Steering
- · Suspension
- Braking
- · Wheels and Tyres
- Fabrication
- Project

Assessment takes place in the form of practical and Written theory assessments with some oral questioning of knowledge.

Learners will be expected to produce supporting evidence for inclusion in their assessment portfolio which will be graded at Pass, Merit or Distinction. There will be an external online synoptic exam.

Year one of the programme involves developing skills and knowledge and collecting evidence for your portfolio and carrying out practical assessment. The majority of year 2 is completion of your project as well as any theory exams.



# **Engineering rules**

- **Correct PPE** must be worn at all times when carrying out practical tasks.
- NO photos or information relating to the college, staff, or equipment is to be shared on social media
- No phones in class/workshop these cause potentially dangerous distractions. Any phone seen will need to be handed to a member of staff immediately.

- The use or possession of alcohol or narcotic substances are forbidden on the college and WILL result in disciplinary action.
- All visitors to the Engineering department MUST be met with politeness and courtesy.
- All staff and tutors should be treated with respect at all times.

## Student dress code

# **Accident procedures**

If an accident occurs when the first aid is needed, you need to report the accident to your instructor who will assess the situation. If first aid is required then a member of staff with first aid training will be called, they can be identified by having first aid crosses on their lanyard. The first aid boxes can be found in the staff offices and workshop walls.

All accidents and near misses must be reported to a member of staff.

- Ensure the area is safe and prevent any further accidents from happening
